KCCC participates in a variety of projects throughout the year that involve fundraising, community service, and assisting children locally and worldwide. We continue to fully fund high school scholarships, local deserving community organizations, and have increased funding of our annual Holiday Toy Drive.

Why support Colonial Capital Kiwanis? . . . *Helping Children.*

In 2021, the Williamsburg Regional Library (WRL) opened the Kiwanis Kids Idea Studio. KCCC teamed with the other area Kiwanis clubs in supporting the WRL's and James City County's renovation of the Children's Library. We are excited by the bright, airy, and family friendly space, the new furniture, children height shelving, the Studio's market place, and most importantly the multi-media and science exhibits which bring STEM concepts to life. The Kiwanis Kids Idea Studio will positively impact the lives of our community's children for years to come.

- During our annual Holiday Toy Drive, members collect funds for children. In concert with the Salvation Army, House of Mercy, and Grove Christian Outreach Center we supply toys, books, clothes, books, and food baskets to families reaching over 550 children.



- We tutor at local elementary schools and sponsor middle-school basketball, volleyball, and several other sports tournaments.
- Each year, we donate age-appropriate books to families, school libraries, and Head Start.
- In another joint effort with the other area Kiwanis Clubs, KCCC acquired and donated a trackless train to James City County's Parks and Recreation.
